Note from the Editors

The publication of the third volume of this journal coincides with two changes, perhaps the most obvious of which is a new cover design.

The Note from the Editors section of Volume 2 portended a bright future for the journal. While we still have great faith in the long-term prospects of the journal as reflected in the calibre of the contributions to this volume, difficulties over the last year have led us to conclude that a further organizational change is needed. Members of the editorial team have had great difficulty in producing this edition. The last 12 months have seen one member of the team overseas for an extended period, another overseas for a briefer period and the illness of a further member. This shortage of manpower, together with trying to produce a quality journal on a financial shoestring, has led us to conclude that, in the interests of the journal, past and future contributors as well as the readership, the journal needs to be 'taken over' by a more highly resourced organization. Hereinafter therefore, the journal will be produced by the Association for Canadian Studies in Australia and New Zealand (ACSANZ).

The difficulties referred to above account for the late publication of Volume 3. The Executive of ACSANZ assure us that not only will the journal's appearance be more timely in the future, but that it is also intended that 2 numbers per year will appear. Indeed, manuscripts have already been submitted for the next edition and are in the process of being refereed. We are sure that you will continue to support the journal under the new editorial team in the same positive way as you have supported us in the past.
